

Operatory renovation completed !



Renovations have begun at the Clinic. After much planning and some last minute modifications, Operatory 3 in our clinic has been completely renovated. This room, like the remainder of our clinic has seen no substantive changes since we moved down from Sherbourne Street in 1995.

Here are photographs of the clinic room prior to and after the renovation process. The new room is clean, has top of the line cabinetry, a chair capable of being accessed by medically compromised patients and patients in wheel chairs and extra in-room storage space. Additionally, and since we have gone to a panoramic and intra-oral digital imaging systems and an electronic chart we have done away with much of the paper, processing chemistry, and films. This makes the room not only clean but green!

The specially-designed cabinetry by Adec ® corporation are high quality and resistant to scratching, scuffing and water damage. All had to be custom-made for our clinic. The dental chair and unit too were manufactured by Adec corporation and installed by a combination of our technical staff including our plumber, electrician, as well as by technicians from Patterson dental under the supervision of Joy Colegate. Finishing touches to the room were accomplished by our PMH staff painter.

This is the first operatory of seven planned operatory renovations and renovation of our in-house dental laboratory that are long overdue. The funds to undertake this particular renovation were provided by our own dentists in cooperation with our friends and partners at the Princess Margaret Hospital Foundation.
